

Transnational Cooperation: From Gyor to Italy

Partner meetings help refine training content, strengthen quality assurance and prepare piloting.

Transnational meetings are key moments in BatPower because they allow partners to review progress, solve implementation questions and connect project content with practice. In 2025, partner meetings supported both WP2 completion and the transition from material development to piloting.

TPM2 in Hungary

The second transnational project meeting in Gyor, hosted by Lukacs Technical School, enabled partners to review the project timeline, discuss research outputs and coordinate next steps. The meeting also included practical insight into vocational education equipment, hybrid and electric vehicles, and consultation with Maroti Academy, where partners discussed modern learning programmes on high-voltage automotive batteries.

TPM3 in Italy

The third transnational project meeting was hosted by ECOLE in Lomazzo, Italy, in November 2025. Partners reviewed WP3 training materials, prepared WP4 piloting, clarified quality assurance and valorisation tools, and strengthened dissemination planning. The programme included a study visit to ENAIP Varese and an industry visit to a Volkswagen-Skoda dealership focused on electric vehicle maintenance and high-voltage battery procedures.

Why these meetings matter

These meetings helped partners move from planning to implementation. They supported technical and pedagogical review of the materials, improved the shared understanding of BatTech training needs and helped connect classroom content with real industry practice.

Meeting outcomes

- Improved shared understanding of BatTech training needs.
- Review of modular materials and learning outcomes.
- Preparation of piloting and validation tools.
- Stronger cooperation between project partners and stakeholders.

What comes next: After TPM3, the project moved more visibly into the Training of Trainers and national pilot preparation phase.



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
